TOPIC 4 – Treasurer's Report (presented by Lars Krogvold)

- ISPAD's financial status is currently very healthy.
- Fiscal year change to calendar year (1 Jan to 31 December) has been implemented and has been effective since 1 January 2022.
- Fiscal year 2022 (January 1 to December 31) Preliminary Results:
 - Figures:
 - Total Income: 776,432 GBP
 - Final expenditure: 877,050 GBP
 - Net Income (Income-Expenditure) = -100,618 GBP (loss)
 - -> Year with highest Income and Expenditure for ISPAD
 - Membership Income has decreased for 2022. ISPAD's Treasurer appeals to all ISPAD Members to encourage colleagues to join ISPAD:
 - As Individual member (see here:
 - https://www.ispad.org/page/newfeestructure9
 - As Team Member -> discounted membership fee is available for Diabetes Teams coming from the same institute. See here for more information: <u>https://www.ispad.org/page/team</u>
 - Highest expenditure category is Research & Education
 - Support costs have increased back to pre-COVID-19 levels, with Meetings taking place again face to face.
 - Budget Forecast 2023:
 - Currently a small profit forecasted with a net Income of 21,528 GBP
 - Due to uncertain world financial situation in 2023, the income forecast has been kept conservative (similar amount to fiscal year 2019-2020)
 - Money in bank as of 31 August 2022 1,521,565 GBP. ISPAD aims to keep 1.5 to 2 years' worth of cash reserves as security in case of adverse financial results. As ISPAD's operational budget is increasing it is important for these cash reserves to also increase.
 - Corporate Membership has increased by 211% since 2018, thanks to Sylvia Lion's lead on Corporate Relations since then.

TOPIC 5 – Communications Director & Social Media Report (presented by Eduardo Calliari)

- Thank you to Communications Board members and volunteers, and particularly to Roque Cardona-Hernandez who will be taking on the role of Communications Director after ISPAD 2022.
- Performance of Newsletter August 2022: 2084 subscribers, 47% open rate, 17,8% click rate (increase since 2021)
- Website Performance Decrease in % of Sessions, Pageviews and Users but numbers are still good compared to pre-COVID-19 phase. Performance should increase once the Guidelines 2022 have been released.
- Performance of Twitter 19% increase in followers since 2021 (2,688 followers currently)
- Performance of Facebook 10% increase in followers since 2021 (4,481 followers currently)
- Performance of LinkedIn Almost double amount of followers since August 2021 (616 currently)





TOPIC 6 – Science School for Healthcare Professionals 2022 (presented by Steven James on behalf of Megan Paterson)

- 28 applications 15 participants offered a place (representation from Australia, United Kingdom, Ireland, Liberia, Kenya, Canada, Poland, Netherlands, Israel, India, Qatar). Three participants were unable to attend due to visa issue and family reasons.
- 5 Faculty members (Australia, Denmark, USA, UAE).
- Wide distribution of professions: nurses, dietitians and psychologist.
- Life for a Child was thanked for supporting additional costs for a participant from Liberia.
- Topics covered include:
 - Research questions
 - o Literature reviews
 - Research methodologies
 - Statistical analyses
 - Grant and abstract writing
- Participants presented research projects with a wide range of ideas including
 - Service improvement for cystic fibrosis-related diabetes clinic
 - o Dietary studies to optimize insulin delivery for problematic foods
 - o Development of psychology resources for newly diagnosed young people with diabetes
 - Qualitative studies to improve outcomes in young people with disordered eating and type 1 diabetes
 - Diabetes education for schools in Poland
 - o Improving outcomes in people with diabetes in less resourced countries
- NEW: time was allocated for the JENIOUS Group to speak with participants.
- Faculty is looking to establish more measurable data and have therefore requested delegates to provide updates on their projects.
- Succession for 2023: Megan Paterson is stepping down as convenor. Her role will be taken on by Steven James. Two new faculty members need to be recruited for 2023, including a dietitian, and at least one local allied HCP from the Netherlands.

TOPIC 7 – Corporate Relations (presented by Sylvia Lion)

- Sylvia thanked the ISPAD Executive Board, Advisory Council and Membership for their trust.
- Objectives 2022:
 - o Activating relationships with existing partner by F2F meetings, CPAB
 - Initiate new partnerships (1 new partner this year)
 - Review Partners: contacts, people, portfolio, structure
 - o Finalize implementation of processes, reports, requests, due diligence due diligence
 - Plan 2023 -> requests must be ready by mid-year in order to plan for the following year, as companies plan their budgets along this timeline.
 - Support leadership and committees/Working groups (relationship with other organizations, special projects)





- 2022 Partners Dexcom, Lilly, Medtronic, Novo Nordisk, Sanofi, Abbott, Lifescan, ProventionBio. Insulet and Tandem stepped down for 2022.
- Other Partners: Children with Diabetes, DeDoc, EUDF, FID, IDF (some MoUs are in progress).
- In Summary:
 - Disappointing post pandemic year :
 - More local focus (companies less likely to support internationally)
 - Impact of virtual
 - Changes in personnel
 - ROI (companies need to see the ROI as they are not foundations investing in charities)
 - Areas for improvement:
 - new partners

- Summary
 - o In total 25 guideline chapters completed
 - >250 authors representing >55 countries globally
 - o Mix of early career, mid career and senior clinicians
 - o Most chapters included a person with diabetes or carer
 - Majority of chapters have new first authors
 - All writing groups met by zoom at least once
 - \circ $\;$ What's new is highlighted at the start of each chapter $\;$
 - o Limited resources is now a stand-alone guideline

Other unique aspects of 2022 guidelines

 - Project management/co-ordination/communication/support
 - Literature searches, referencing
 - Rigorous process of evidence grading (ADA criteria)
 - Harmonization of guidance across chapters and other guidelines

TOPIC 9 – E-learning Update (presented by Brynn Marks on behalf of Joseph Wolfsdorf)

- Committee is diverse:
 - Representation from Australia, Europe, North Africa, USA; no members from Asia.
 - Professions: physicians, diabetes educators, psychologists, and nurse specialists.
- Members of the committee were thanked for their engagement, excellent ideas and productive discussions.
- Principal activity: to identify suitable topics for webinars targeted to meet the education needs of a diverse international audience caring for children across a wide range of resource settings (focus on topics relevant to the entire ISPAD membership, rather than highlighting the cutting edge developments).

Webinar Statistics:

- Plans for future webinars:
 - Collaboration with editors of ISPAD 2022 guidelines to focus on updates and revisions to guidelines. Loredana Marcovecchio, an associate editor for 2022 guidelines and member of eLearning committee, will serve as liaison.
 - Poll Everywhere subscription enables real-time, interactive questions during eLearning Webinars, as well as Pre- and Post-test questions.
- ESPE-ISPAD E-Learning Modules European Council for CME has awarded <u>free</u> accreditation for 10 ISPAD diabetes topics <u>https://www.espe-elearning.org/.</u>





- E-learning App Development:
 - Eda Cengiz and Brynn Marks leading this.
 - Rational for focusing on App-based e-learning: 83% of the world has access to a smartphone vs ~50% with computer access.
 - Prototype was developed, but stalled due to difficulties with contractual negotiations over cost with institution in Turkey.
 - Currently exploring collaboration with academic institution and/or app development company

TOPIC 10 – Science School for Physicians 2022 (presented by Zdenek Sumnik)

- 21 pediatric diabetologists selected from 51 applicants based on CVs, projects, regions.
- 16 countries, 5 continents represented.

TOPIC 12 – SWEET Update (presented by Thomas Danne)

- Active member centers are key for SWEET in order to provide meaningful data. Inactive centers were therefore removed in 2020. Membership therefore dipped but has been picking up again in 2022.

 - More involvement of Patient Voice by measuring patient related outcomes (PRO) -> efforts led by Karin Lange, with the support of a patient advisory board

TOPIC 13 – JENIOUS Group Update (presented by Agata Chobot)

- JENIOUS is open to ALL young (age <40) ISPAD members (paid annual fee) regardless of their profession.
- Leadership Tiago Jeronimo is ending his term as JENIOUS leader this year. Call for applications for next JENIOUS leader is running.
- Ambassadors current ambassadors were thanked for their support with JENIOUS tasks. Next call for JENIOUS ambassadors will be in April 2023 (will be announced in the ISPAD Newsletter).
- Research Projects: 5 JENIOUS-supported research projects have been published since 2016 in Pediatric Diabetes journal. 8 further projects are ongoing.
- JENIOUS-Children with Diabetes Award 2022 will be announced during JENIOUS session at ISPAD 2022. 7 proposals received this year.
- Networking activities:
 - Prize and Elections Committee
 - Communication Committee

- Collaboration with ESPE's YES group (early career members of ESPE).
- Aim to increase engagement of early career allied healthcare professionals in JENIOUS activities -> JENIOUS leadership attended the SSHP for the first time this year.

TOPIC 14 – Pediatric Diabetes Journal (presented by Phil Zeitler)

- Wiley has transferred Pediatric Diabetes to their open access affiliate, Hindawi. This will mean structural changes to the journal as well as to the editorial process. The transition took place officially on October 12, 2022.
- Current Editorial team, led by Phil Zeitler, Fergus Cameron, and Sabine Hofer will be staying on as Senior Editors. Associate Editors will be staying on during transition as well.
- Changes this implies:
 - Open access means that submitting authors will have to pay a publication fee (some discounts available).
 - o Additional editors will be needed under Hindawi.
 - Pros increase in number of views for each paper published (which in turn should increase the impact factor of Pediatric Diabetes, provided that only articles of high quality are published). Publication turnaround should be faster.
 - Cons costs for investigators/authors (discounts available). Hindawi has also declined publishing the Guidelines in 2026.
- As a result of these changes, *ISPAD has decided that Pediatric Diabetes will no longer be the official journal of the society*. An alternative publication solution is being researched.
