TOPIC 1 – Welcome presented by Jannet Svensson:

ISPAD 2025 Conference Overview and key statistics:

- Total Delegates: 1,584 – Largest congress outside of Europe so far
- Countries Represented: 93
- Invited Speakers: 77 from 32 countries
- Abstracts Accepted: 760 from 84 countries

Registration Statistics – Geographic Distribution:

A breakdown of registration by region was shared, with the top 10 countries of origin represented. Key statistics included:

- **North America:** 47%
- **Europe:** 28,5%
- Additional regional statistics were also shown, illustrating the global reach of the event.

TOPIC 2 – President's Report (presented by Fergus Cameron)

Strategic Goals & Focus Areas:

The President outlined ISPAD's key strategic directions and accomplishments over the past year:

Highlighted 3 key areas that we wanted to focus on for this year: equity, diabetes support and crisis situation and screening and disease modifying therapies in Type 1 Diabetes.

- **Equity**
 - Ongoing. Technology. Review of educational support activities with
 - key focus on sustainability, opportunity costs and equity
- **Diabetes support in crisis situations**
 - We have joined the International Alliance for Diabetes Action (IADA).
 - Agata Chobot, Nancy Elbarbary and Deniz Özalp Kizilay = ISPAD representatives
 - (Real world example of ISPAD's role in linking all actors: August 2025 support for Dr Kalehezo in Congo – because of conflict: lack of insulin had a terrible impact on his clinic ISPAD with IADA and LFaC insulin was sent within 2 or 3 weeks.)
- **Screening and disease modifying therapies in type 1 diabetes.**

 - led by Michael Haller and Jennifer Cooper – already receive 2 consensus statements

TOPIC 3 – Treasurer's Report (presented by Sabine Hofer)

ISPAD restructuring from UK

Why restructuring from UK:

- ISPAD established as Charity based in the UK 2005 (CHARITY NUMBER 1126927)
- Due to increase of ISPAD's annual turnover VAT exempt no longer given in the UK
- Despite annual audits through Charity Commission and Companies House now additional expensive external audit required (2024/2025)
- UK governance rules and banking operations increasingly difficult (even more after Brexit) – specially for a society with frequent turn over of Executive Board
- Banking issues in UK appeared difficult throughout the years
- Corporate partners from industry facing increased complexity with payments in UK
- Need of separated operating account in Germany run by K.I.T.

Process initiated 2023/2024

- Overall location study performed by K.I.T. (Germany, Belgium, Switzerland, Austria)
- Selection criteria :Creation of an Association, Accounting Requirements, Taxation,
- Civil Liability, Insurance, Ease of operations
- Interviews were made and questionnaires were sent so to understand better the differences between the countries. Past EB, current EB and corporate partners were consulted.
- Involved our societies past presidents and past EB members into discussion process
- Informed our partners from industry about our plans – included their input, positive feedback
- Informed our sponsoring partners (e.g. BT1D) – positive feedback
- EB has selected Vienna/Austria as the place meeting our needs best

Vienna/Austria: Site visit in Vienna by EB members. Article of associations – translated into German. Registration process can be initiated right after our annual meeting.

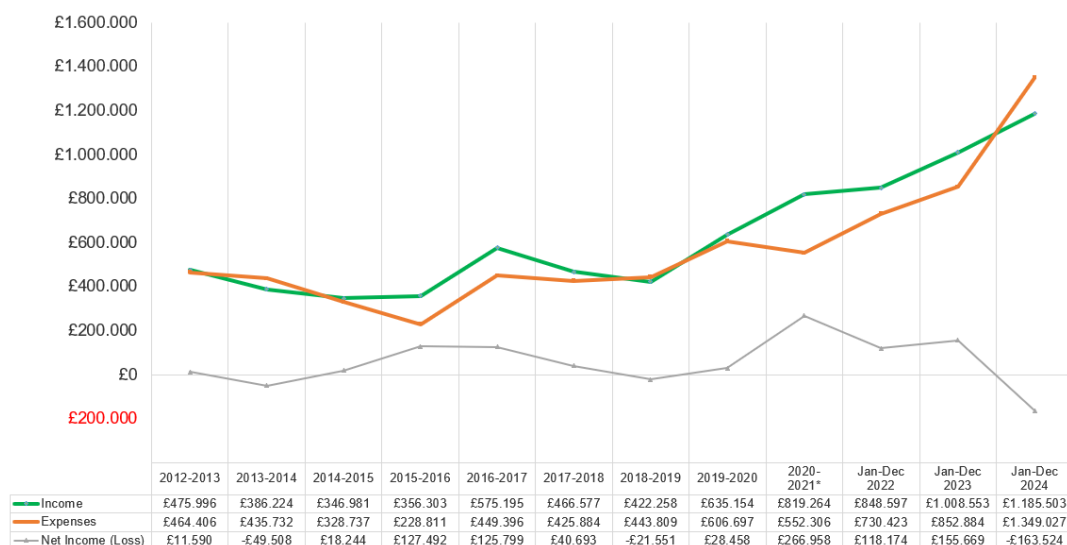
Elections live: Final vote is being launched to all ISPAD members at the General Assembly

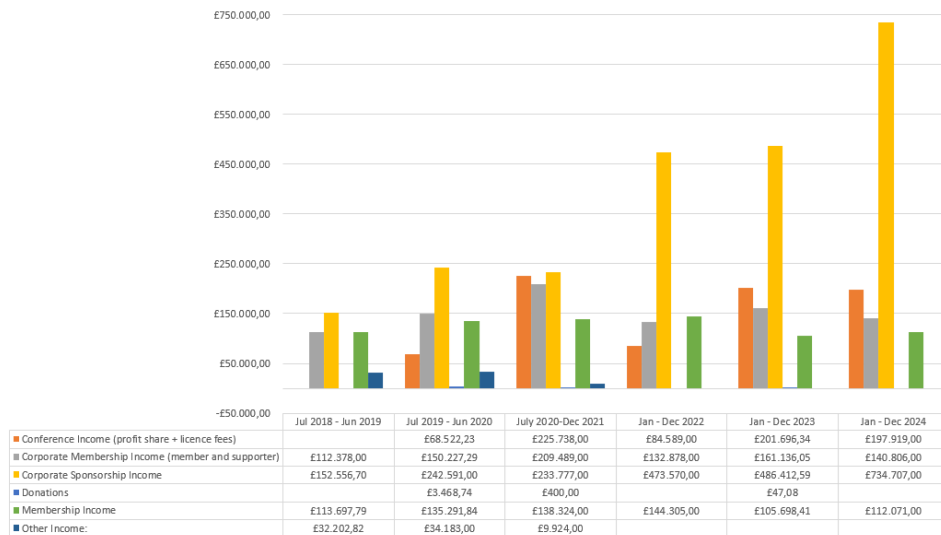

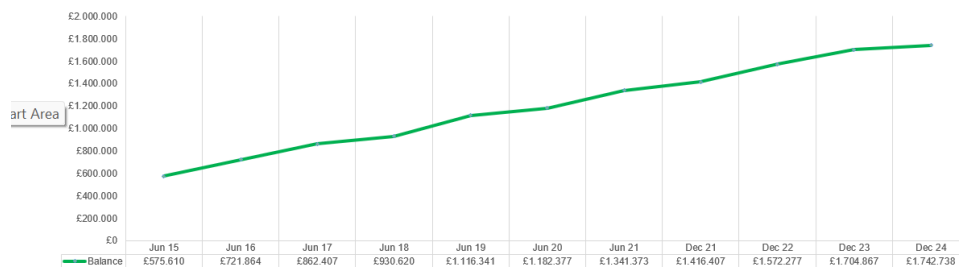

TOPIC 9: ISPAD Science School for Physicians 2025 presented by Olga Kordonouri

Location: Hannover, Germany

- 24 participants were chosen from 75 applications
