

- o Income Groups and Fee Structure:
 - Based on country residence and profession type
 - The country of residence categories have been expanded to include a reduced fee for Upper-Middle-Income countries members. We have reduced all membership fees for members from these countries by 50% (among these countries are Brazil, China, Serbia, South Africa)
 - Fees for members from Low income countries have been waived (among these are Afghanistan, Ethiopia, Tajikistan and Uganda)
- New Membership Category for the Diabetes Team:
 - Team Membership
 - Max 5 Individuals, among them max 2 physicians
 - Team member has the same benefits as an ordinary member
 - Primary objective
 - To increase the total number of allied health care professionals becoming ISPAD members, and thus widen the ISPAD family
- Secondary objectives are
 - More members will make ISPAD more attractive to current sponsors
 - More Allied Healthcare Professionals-members may attract other sponsors
 - Higher income from membership fees





AGENDA POINT 15 - ANY OTHER BUSINESS/ Q &A

- ISPAD Member queries / Q&A:
 - Emeritus Membership & Benefits:
 - Question: Any possibility of setting up a zero cost Emeritus Membership category for ISPAD seniors from 65 years of age? Ideally would include free registration for annual meetings as well so that we would encourage our most experienced members to continue participation and mentorship? (Stu Brink)
 - ISPAD's Answer: Your proposal is noted, as it by now, "Former full members who are retired are not required to pay a membership fee (unless they voluntarily wish to pay a membership fee in order to support ISPAD). Free membership is available for retired members upon request. But, that doesn't include free registration for annual meetings. We will discuss this in the Executive Board Meetings.





- JENIOUS Membership:
 - Question: Who/How to join JENIOUS?
 - **ISPAD's Answer**: Any ISPAD Member under the age of 40 can join (upon regular application for ISPAD membership or within their membership profile if already an ISPAD member). All professionals working in the field of pediatric diabetes are welcome to join, including members of the allied healthcare professions.
- Representation of Allied Healthcare Professionals in ISPAD Advisory Council:
 - Question: I wish to propose expanding the Advisory Council to include an additional non-physician member (Joe Wolfsdorf)
 - Answer: proposal will certainly be considered for 2021 and could be voted on at next AGM
- Representation of Allied Healthcare Professionals in ISPAD:
 - **Question:** Going forward should the advisory council structure change to ensure that all AHP groups are represented e.g. nurse/educator, dietitian and psychology? (Francesca Annan)
 - **Answer:** ISPAD finds this a good proposal and suggests that Joe Wolfsdorf and Francesca Annan work on a joint proposal combining the points they have both raised.
